

**MORGAN**

Tribute to Dave Morgan

Allan David Morgan was born at the family homestead on December 22, 1924 during a severe blizzard, to John and Elsie Morgan. He was the youngest of five children, Jack, Geoffery, Sybil, Clarice, and himself. Dave is survived by his wife Irene of 55 years, two sons, John and Richard and his wife Wanda and her son, Stephen of Calgary, his eldest brother Jack and his sister-in-law Mildred Brackett of Pender Island, B.C. and numerous nieces and nephews. Dave attended school at Harmattan and later the Olds College. His younger years were spent with his father between the Morgan and Heaton Ranch est. 1904 (now known as Red Deer River Ranches) and the farm at Harmattan est. 1899. Morgans ran cattle in the forestry and west of Sundre until 1969 making it 60 years of Morgan cattle in the West Country. In 1999 Dave and his family celebrated the 100th anniversary of their Bar 9V homestead. In 1951 Dave married Irene Armstrong of Veteran, with Richard arriving in 1959 and John in 1960. Dave had a deep love for his land and his cattle. Using his natural management skills and his sense of timing, he purchased land and raised cattle building the Bar 9V into a very successful farming operation in the Harmattan Area. In 1972 Morgans were granted a permit to import cattle from Europe which was the beginning of their Pinzgauer herd. His love for cattle can be attested by the fine Pinzgauer herd we see on the Dog Pound flat. Dave and Irene traveled far and wide both for business and pleasure to Australia, New Zealand, Brazil, Argentina, British Guiana, Costa Rica, Mexico, Grand Cayman, Panama, states in the US including Alaska, also to Europe and Southern Africa. Dave loved to travel observing how other people lived, but each time upon their return, driving west from Olds on Hwy 27, to the top of the Dog Pound Valley, Dave would always remark, "I haven't seen anything better than this." Of recent years despite failing health, Dave remained very involved in the farming operation until his passing on July 25, 2006. Cremation followed at his request.
